Hens in Festus— The City Council passed an Ordinance providing guidelines for permitting up to four hens inside the City limits. This decision was made after the citizen survey did not produce a strong statement either for or against the chickens. There are guidelines for placement of chicken coops, 1/2

acre minimum lot size, and a one time permit fee of \$30. Residents that are interested in raising hens can view the full **Ordinance 4066** on the City website and may contact the Public Works building at 937-6646 for lot size inquiries and permits.

Budget Message for Fiscal Year 2013

The Council's City mandate for the new budget year was to include necessary street, sewer, and water projects, keep the town safe, reward the employees, and no deficit. Through the hard work vision the of department heads. employees, and Council we have achieved a balanced budget that will afford some major street projects, a safe and active community and a small raise to employees.

Our upcoming major street projects include Central Avenue, South Mill Street, American Legion Drive, and Horine Road planning phase.

Our water/sewer plans include creating a plan for extending service to England Drive, continue lining sewers, put a plan in place for infrastructure repair and maintenance, and come up with a solution to get rid of the rusty water in parts of town.

Our Police and Fire Departments will continue to protect and serve. They are always available for outreach. Sunset Park will be ready for softball in Spring 2013.

We will be purchasing new accounting software and replacing an aging phone system.

Our budget this year will be \$16,333,867, and we hope to replace some of the reserves.

Tourism Commission Budget

The Tourism Commission is made up of representatives of local businesses and residents of the City of Festus. They are commissioned with the responsibility to authorize the use of our local Tourism tax that is charged at our hotels. Their approvals for the FY 2013 budget are listed below.

Brochures— \$10,000 to sponsor brochures highlighting the parks, historic downtown, and shopping areas.

Highway Signs— The Commission approved \$17,000 to install "Welcome to Festus" signs along I-55 at the Highway A exit and funding to keep the grass maintained.

Tour of Lights—The Commission approved funding of \$1,000 for the Tour of Lights.

Blues Funk Event—The Commission approved funding of \$5,000 for this event.

Central Avenue Project—

- The reconstruction of Central Avenue is scheduled to begin October I.
- The project is expected to last 120 days, which may be interrupted and prolonged by inclement weather.
- 90% of the time, there will be one lane open.
- Resurfacing will be completed in sections of 2,000 feet beginning at N. Mill Street and going west.

American Legion Drive— This project is on schedule to begin in 2013.
