5. The finished solar eclipse viewer will look like this, although you could dress up and personalize it with some paint or astronomy themed stickers.



Don't forget that solar viewing glasses are available for purchase at Public Works and the library for \$1 per pair. Here's how to use your new viewer:

- A. Stand with your back to the sun
- B. Look thru the viewing window
- C. Move the box around until the image of the sun comes in through the pinhole and is projected onto the bottom of the box
- D. Watch as the circle gets smaller and smaller when the moon moves between the earth and the sun. While the sun is completely covered you may look directly at the sun with no eye protection.
