### **Water Bill Reminders**

Every month Public Works get inundated with numerous calls and questions about due dates and when bills have to be paid to avoid disconnection.



Bills are mailed 4 - 5 days before the last day of the month so that residents have them by the 1st of the month. The due date is always the 15th and late fees (9% of the current water portion of the bill) are assessed on the 16th after all payments in the drop box-

es at city hall and public works as well as all electronic payments that came in overnight have been posted to accounts. Anyone walking into public works to pay their bill is not assessed a late fee on the 16th if overnight payments are still being posted. All outstanding balances on the 1st of the month are subject to immediate disconnection. These outstanding balances are shown near the top of the water bill. City ordinance allows for disconnection for any past due amount. If water is disconnected, the entire past due amount plus the \$25 reconnect fee must be paid before services can be restored. Also, per city ordinance, someone must answer the door when water department personnel comes by to reconnect services.
